Sunyata, or emptiness, is one of the profoundest teachings in Buddhism. Religious education resources on Buddhism for students.

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In the sutra teachings we call this "emptiness," in tantra "illusion," and in Dzogchen "the single sphere. What it does mean is that things do not exist the way our grasping self supposes they. In Gorampa's approach, ultimate truth is a liberating insight, that is free from even grasping the mind. Ultimate reality is the union of both emptinesses. Though we perceive a world of concrete and discrete objects, these objects are "empty" of the identity imputed by their designated labels. Since its conception, has strongly encouraged the people to understand the Truth, Sunyata - Emptiness (Teachings) is, therefore, not sufficient for Buddhists to simply follow the ethical demands of their religion if they have not understood their justification or if their own conviction is not involved.

Empty phenomena are other [different]; non-empty phenomena are other [different]. All subjective and objective realities of conscious experience are forms of this unified state of pure experience.
